**Vehicle and Traffic Law of 2003  
The Village of East Nassau, Rensselaer County, New York**

A local law excluding trucks and other such commercial vehicles in excess of a certain gross weight on certain designated Village roads within the municipal boundaries of the Village of East Nassau.

**Section 1. Title:**

This law shall be known as the Vehicle and Traffic Law of 2003 of the Village of East Nassau.

**Section 2. Purpose and Authority:**

It is the purpose of this law to further the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of East Nassau, to protect residents and properties on the roads listed in the body of this Law and to prevent deterioration of such roads, streets or highways by heavy truck traffic. This Law has been adopted pursuant to the authority granted to villages by section 1640 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

### **Section 3. Definitions**

- A. The words and phrases used in this chapter shall, for the purposes of this Law, have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by Article 1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.
- B. The term “road” has the same meaning and use as the term “street” as used in the Village Law and the term “highway” as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.
- C. The term “Village” means the incorporated Village of East Nassau, located in Rensselaer County, New York.

### **Section 4. Trucks Exclusion on Designated Roads**

Trucks, commercial vehicles, tractors, tractor-trailer combinations, tractor-semitrailer combinations, or tractor-trailer-semitrailer combinations with a gross weight in excess of six-thousand pounds are hereby excluded from the Village roads designated in Section 5 of this Law below. Such exclusion shall not be construed to prevent the delivery or pickup of merchandise, materials or other property along the roads from which such vehicles and combinations are otherwise excluded.

### **Section 5. Designated Roads**

The exclusion of the vehicles and combinations set forth in section 4 above apply to the following Village roads:

- A. Tayer Road – along its entire length from NYS Route 66 to the Village boundary line;
- B. Webster Hill Road - along its entire length from NYS Route 66 to the Village boundary line;
- C. Tsatsawassa Lake Road - along its entire length from NYS Route 66 to the Village boundary line;
- D. Gardner Hill Road - along its entire length from County Route 21 (also known as Dunham Hollow Road) to the Village boundary line; and
- E. Town Garage Road - along its entire length from County Route 16 (also known as Central Nassau Road) to the Village boundary line.
- F. Woodard Road – along its entire length from NYS Route 66 to the Village boundary line.

### **Section 6. Penalties**

Any person guilty of violating any provision of this Law is guilty of a traffic infraction and subject to the penalties provided in section 1800 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

### **Section 7. Severability of Provisions:**

Should any section or provision of this local law be declared null, void, voidable, or invalid, such finding of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this local law.

### **Section 8. Effective Date:**

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York.

**End of Law**
